**WHEREAS**, a Public Law established in the United States Congress in 1952, approved by a Joint Commission, and later amended by Congress and President Reagan with Public Law 100-307 in 1988, affirms that it is essential for us as a nation to set aside and proclaim the first Thursday of May annually as a National Day of Prayer; and,

**WHEREAS**, leaders and citizens of our nation are afforded the privilege of prayer, affirming our spiritual heritage and the free principles upon which our nation was founded; and,
