Proclamation.

WHEREAS, civic prayers and national days of prayer have a long and revered history in America, dating back to the First Continental Congress in 1774; and

WHEREAS, the Declaration of Independence made "the laws of Nature and Nature's God" the foundation of our United States of America and asserted that people have unalienable rights that are Godgiven; and

WHEREAS, in 1988, legislation setting aside the first Thursday in May annually as National Day of Prayer was passed unanimously by both houses of Congress and signed by President Ronald Reagan; and

WHEREAS, the National Day of Prayer is an opportunity for Americans of all faiths to join in prayer to give thanks for blessings received, request healing for wounds endured, and ask God to guide our leaders and bring harmony to the United States and her citizens; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper to give prayers of thankfulness for the religious freedoms and civil liberties with which we are blessed and observe a Day of Prayer in New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, this year marks the 74th Annual National Day of Prayer with the theme "Pour Out to the God of Hope and Be Filled";

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Philip D. Murphy, Governor of the State of New Jersey, do hereby proclaim:
