### **Annual National Broadcast**

Our National Broadcast was hosted by Kathy Branzell and A.R. Bernard, founder of the Christian Cultural Center in Brooklyn, New York, at the Museum of the Bible and in the Congressional Auditorium in the United States Capitol. Through our partnerships with Christian ministry and media leaders including Waterstone, Daystar, God TV, NRB TV, CBN News, CTN, TLN Media, Revelation TV, Bott Radio Network, Salem Communications, and many other national and local networks and stations, we reached into 195 countries with a call to prayer for America and a clear presentation of the Gospel. Together, we impacted nearly 110 million homes in U.S. and over 2.2 billion around the world.
